- Sept. 5** **Jeri Mae Rowley** is a professional speaker, trainer and “saddle-maker’s daughter” who has built a very successful business speaking throughout the United States on topics such as business and communications.
- Sept. 12** **Ken Coburn** founded GoEngineer which has been helping engineering, manufacturing, and product design companies innovate and stay competitive for over 27 years. The company has locations in California, Utah, Idaho, Hawaii, Colorado, Nevada, Texas, Oklahoma, Arkansas and Louisiana.
- Sept. 19** **Sue Rice**, a Snow College alumna and former pitcher on the Snow College softball team, founded Cavanagh Services Group, Inc. The company specializes in integrated project management and transportation services for radioactive, hazardous, non-hazardous, toxic and industrial waste disposal.
